books in the Secret Life of Squirrels series. The books are published in Canada, US, Japan and South Korea.



Nancy harnesses wild squirrels' natural sense of curiosity—and love for peanuts—to attract them to meticulously crafted domestic scenes, which she builds and arranges on her back deck.

The squirrels come to investigate and eat the strategically hidden nuts—and in doing so, become participants in a singularly adorable photo shoot.

Monochrome

 Monochrome images are comprised of shades of a single colour e.g. black and white or sepia.

Photographer's Choice

 This is an open category and can include any image the photographer chooses. The composite itself must be created after January 1st 2021.



The entry form will be sent out to members mid-February. All of the instructions for sending your files are on the entry form. You may begin emailing entries through a free app "WeTransfer" on March 1 through to March 6, 2023 to: gbpccomp1@gbpc.ca AND gbpccomp2@gbpc.ca

If you are new to the club and would like to participate in the competition, this is a wonderful opportunity for you to expand your knowledge and experience in photography. This will be the last time that our competition will occur for this year. If you would like to participate, you will need a personal ID# to get started. Please contact me on the website and I will send you one.

Process Summary

- Create a folder on your desktop. Label it with "your name". For example: Mary Poppins
- Place your Entry Form which you will have filled out plus your 4 images for the 2 categories into the folder.
- You then access "WeTransfer" which is a free app, to email your folder to BOTH gbpccomp1@gbpc.ca AND gbpccomp2@gbpc.ca

Ted joined our club in September of 2012. He was an active member, regularly contributing photos to our club competitions. He was also an enthusiastic and thoughtful member, remembered for his cheerful approach and warm smile.

Ted's caring attitude was exemplified by his willingness to step up and serve as our Vice President. Ted served as our Vice President from 2017 to his passing in April of 2022.

Ted's wife, Patricia Dillon, together with her friend Laura Clinton, have generously offered to sponsor an annual award of a \$50 Henry's gift card for the Most Improved Photographer.

It is their way of honouring Ted's love of photography and his support for all those striving to perfect the art of photography. The award will be presented to the winner at our June meeting.

Latow Photographers Guild Seminar & Workshop

Renowned conservation photographer **Neil Ever Osborne** is the speaker at the 2023 Latow Photography Weekend. Neil's theme is **Visual Story-telling for People + Planet**. Join us on April 29 & 30 to be inspired by Neil who is a regular contributor to *Smithsonian* magazine, *World Wildlife Fund Magazine*, and Explorer with National Geographic Society.

There's more: two workshops will focus on Neil's techniques for visual story-telling.

In person only — Saturday 29 April 2023, 9am - 4:30 pm

The day will focus on the theme of People + Planet. Using his faraway adventures with sea turtles and poachers in Mexico, the Kayapo peoples of the Amazon, and mountain gorillas in Africa, Neil's award-winning images reveal the enduring spirit of humanity and the resiliency of nature.

The afternoon will include a Q&A session with the audience and discussion of conservation issues. Neil will describe how visual story-telling can help inform and mobilize concerned individuals.

- Submit **one** (1) image for each monthly theme.
- Sizing: 2000 pixels on the long side.
- Label your image = Month and Your Name (example: January John Doe).

- Have fun!
